

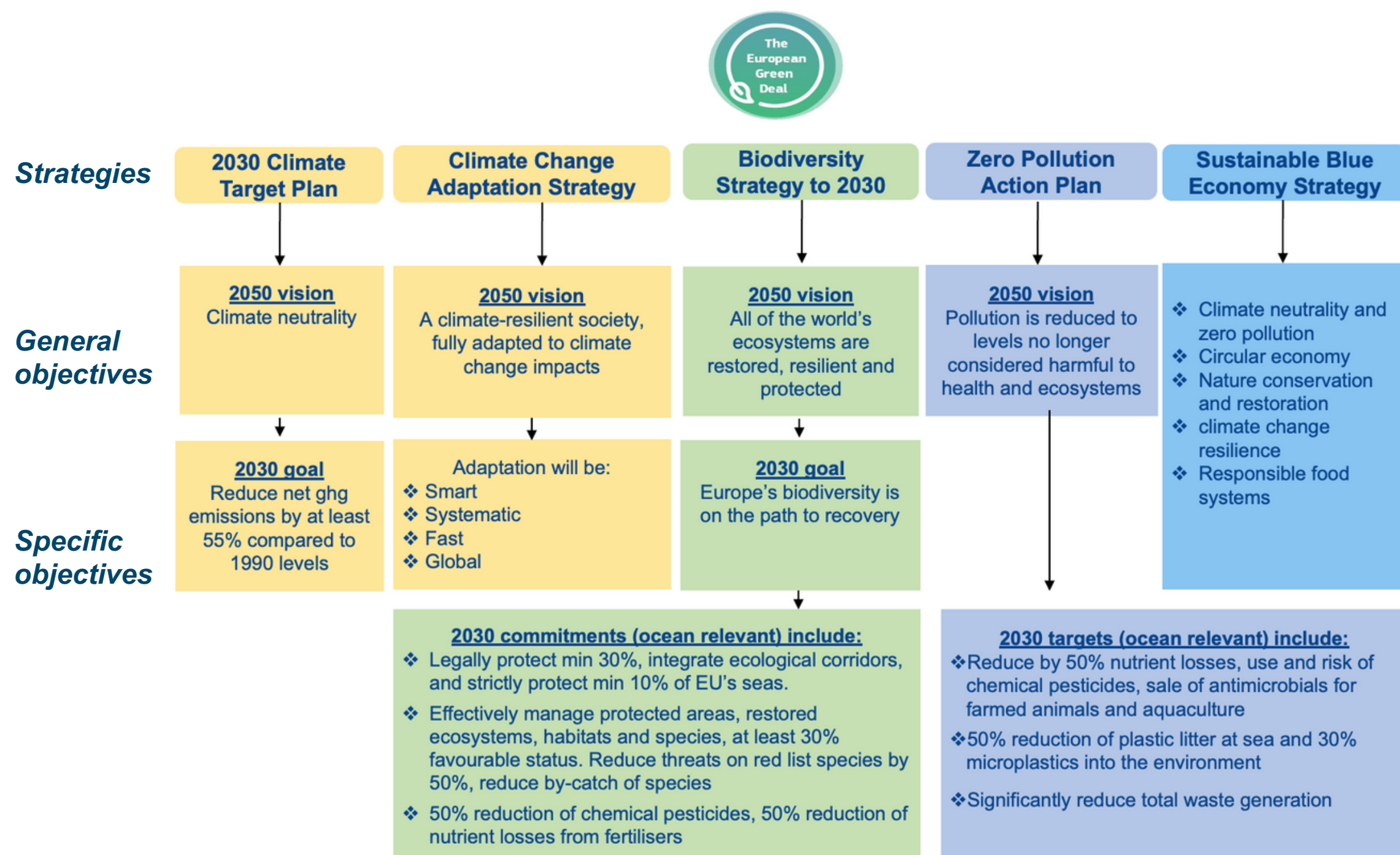

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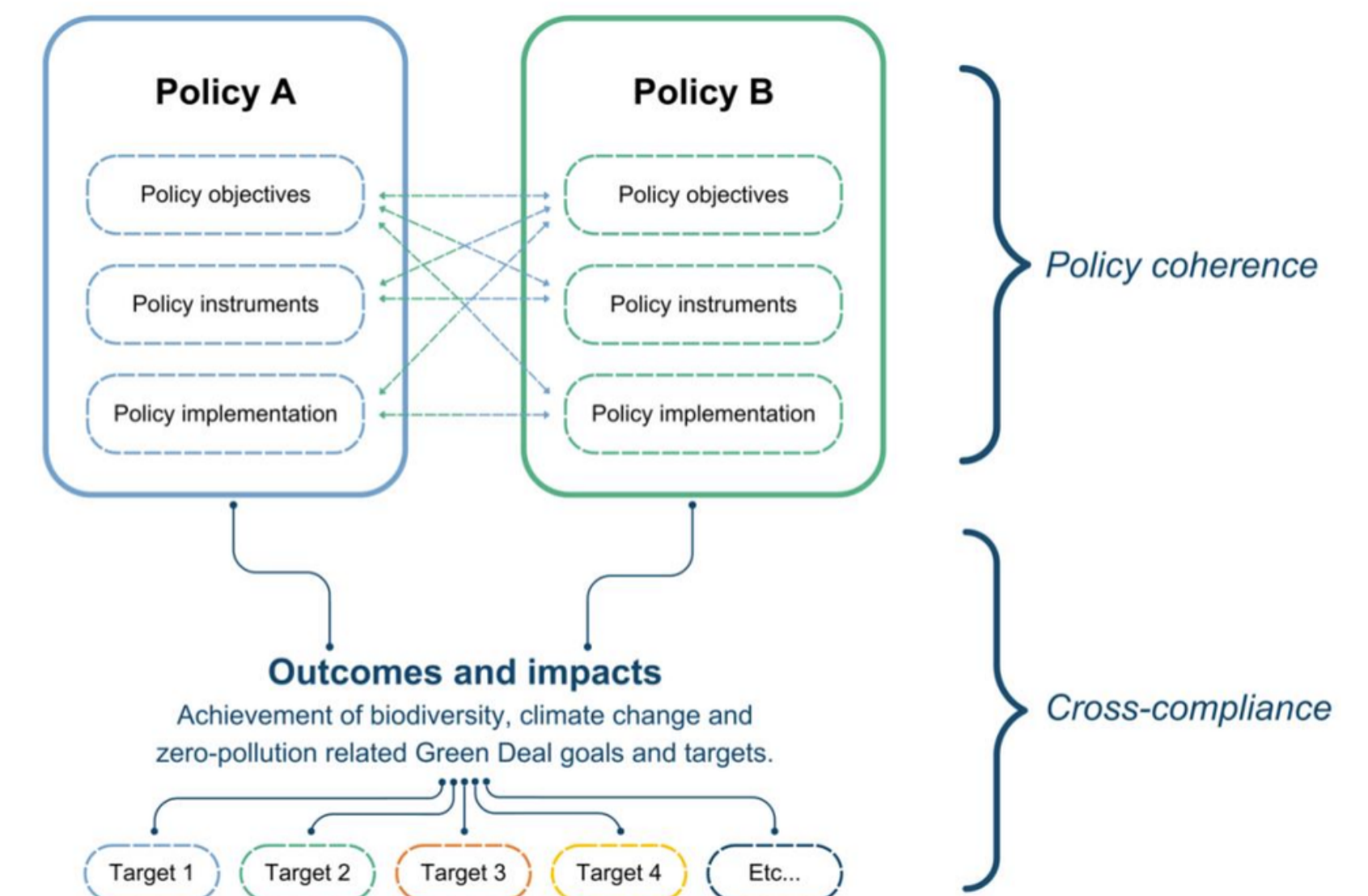
The Challenge

- The European Green Deal is a comprehensive set of policy initiatives for a sustainable future, containing specific objectives for the European seas.
- We need to ensure that progress towards one objective does not negatively affect progress towards other objectives. **We need cross-compliance!**



Our Mission

- CrossGov explores how **policy coherence** affects **cross-compliance** with ocean-related Green Deal objectives for biodiversity, climate change and pollution.
- Policy coherence may
 - Help overcome fragmented governance arrangements
 - Contribute to minimising conflicts and trade-offs
 - Foster synergies and policy effectiveness

The Framework offers a **comprehensive methodological approach** to understand better **where in the policy cycle** or at which **governance level** challenges of coherence emerge and where these can be resolved

We investigate policy coherence in **different directions** (horizontally, vertically) and at **multiple governance levels** (EU, regional, (sub)national)

We investigate policy coherence at **different stages** of the **policy cycle** (policy formulation, design, implementation, evaluation)

The Framework builds upon existing concepts and frameworks, though advances this further to make it fit-for-purpose for comprehensive policy coherence evaluations against the **European Green Deal**

The three components of the Evaluation Framework:

1. Two coherence attributes

- To evaluate level of policy coherence



Three explanatory variables

- To help explain the level of observed coherence



2. Guiding questions that help assess each attribute

3. A simplified scoring system to evaluate to what extent each attribute contributes to policy coherence
